By-law # 1258-81

A By-law to Regulate, Govern and Prohibit the Operation of Motorcycles on Town Property within the Town of Whitby

Being a By-law to regulate, govern and prohibit the operation of motorcycles on Town property within the Town of Whitby.

Whereas, the Municipal Act provides that by-laws may be passed by the Council of every Corporation providing for the use by the public of lands of which the Corporation is the owner and for the regulation of such use and the protection of such lands;

And whereas, the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Whitby deems it necessary and expedient to pass a by-law to regulate, govern and prohibit the operation of motorcycles on Town property within the Town of Whitby;

Now therefore, be it enacted and it is hereby enacted as a by-law of the Corporation of the Town of Whitby by the Council thereof as follows:

1. Definitions
 - (a) "Highway" means a highway defined in the Highway Traffic Act which is under the jurisdiction of the Corporation of the Town of Whitby, including any part or parts thereof;
 - (b) "Motorcycle" means a self-propelled vehicle having a seat or saddle for the use of the driver and designed to travel on not more than three wheels in contact with the ground, and includes a bicycle with a motor attached and a motor scooter;
 - (c) "Town property" means property owned, managed, or controlled by or made available by lease, agreement, or otherwise to the Town or a local board thereof, but does not include a highway.
2. That no person shall operate a motorcycle on Town property except, where by means of one or more signs, it is indicated that such operation is authorized or except on such property as is designed for vehicular travel.
3. That the provisions of Section 2 of this by-law shall not apply to members of a police force operating motorcycles while engaged in the performance of their duties.
4. That any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this by-law is guilty of an offence, and on summary conviction, is liable to a fine of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00), exclusive of costs, for each offence.

5. That by-law 382-70, and the same is hereby repealed.

By-law read a first, second and third time and finally passed this 13th day of October, A.D., 1981.
