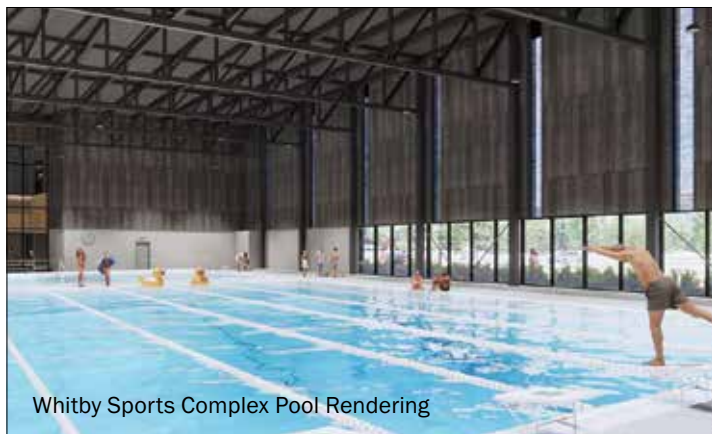

Kayaking at the Port of Whitby

Earlier this year, in our Corporate Strategic Plan engagement, residents told us that Whitby's waterfront is one of the top things that make our community unique – and we agree! We've got all the info you need to enjoy our community this summer.

1. Get on the Water: Port Whitby Marina offers a 420 slip full-service marina, perfect for a leisurely stroll, sunset sail, sailing lessons, or fishing trips. You can even use the Port Whitby Boat Launch for kayaking or stand-up paddling on Lake Ontario. Learn more at whitby.ca/Marina

3. Have a Beach Picnic: Whitby's Waterfront is perfect for a day trip. Pack a picnic and head to Iroquois Beach Park for a sandy shoreline and green space.
