

## **Notice of Passing of Heritage Designation By-law # 8258-26 to Designate a Property of Cultural Heritage Value or Interest under the Provisions of Part IV, Section 29 of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990 (Graydon Goodfellow House)**

Take notice that the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Whitby passed By-law # 8258-26 (Designation By-law) on February 2, 2026, to designate lands municipally known as 618 Athol Street (Graydon Goodfellow House), in the Town of Whitby, in the Regional Municipality of Durham, Ontario, as a property of Cultural Heritage Value or Interest under Part IV, S.29 of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990.

### **Description of Property:**

**The Graydon Goodfellow House** municipally known as 618 Athol Street in Whitby, is generally located on the west side of Athol Street, at the northwest corner of Athol Street and Trent Street East, and legally described as Part of Lot 23 and Part of Lot 24, 6th Double Range, Plan H-50031, Town of Whitby, Regional Municipality of Durham.

As required under S.29 of the *Ontario Heritage Act*, the Town of Whitby is hereby providing notice of its decision to the property owner and the Ontario Heritage Trust.

### **Appeal to the Ontario Land Tribunal (OLT):**

**TAKE NOTICE** that an appeal of the Designation By-law for the Property by those persons permitted to appeal under Section 29 of *the Ontario Heritage Act* may be made by submitting a Notice of Appeal with the OLT and Town Clerk of the Corporation of the Town of Whitby by 4:30 p.m. on or before March 6<sup>th</sup>, 2026 (within 30 days of this notice). A Notice of Appeal must set out the reasons for the objection to the Designation By-law. If you wish to appeal to the Ontario Land Tribunal (OLT), please see below for options to file a notice of appeal. The filing of an appeal, either electronically through the OLT e-file service, by email, or in-person after 4:30 p.m. on the date noted above will be deemed to have been received the next business day.

Appeals may be submitted by filing a notice of appeal with the Clerk of The Corporation of the Town of Whitby and making online payment of the applicable appeal fee via the OLT e-file service. First-time users will need to register for a My Ontario Account at <https://olt.gov.on.ca/e-file-service/> and will select 'Whitby (Town)' as the Approval Authority for the appeal submission.

Alternatively, appeals may be submitted to the Clerk of The Corporation of the Town of Whitby by email to [clerk@whitby.ca](mailto:clerk@whitby.ca) or by mail or in-person at 575 Rossland Road East, Whitby, ON L1N 2M8 using the appropriate OLT forms found at <https://olt.gov.on.ca/about-olt>. In addition to your notice of appeal, please ensure that you provide a certified cheque or money order for the applicable appeal fee, payable to the Minister of Finance. Your notice of appeal must set out the reasons for the appeal.
